Financial assistance is not available for non-preference students.

This year, the Auckland Catholic Diocese also has a second Attendance Dues support scheme for anyone experiencing hardship due to Covid-19. The Auckland Catholic Diocese Covid-19 Support Scheme can only be used to cover the requirement to pay dues from Term 2-4 2020. The Covid-19 Attendance Dues Support Scheme includes non-preference students.
