Principal's Message

Welcome back to our third school term. Hopefully, our school year is back on track. We are so privileged to be living in New Zealand during this worldwide pandemic.

We ended last term with a celebration assembly for our Matariki Week. It was a lovely occasion with a visiting kapa haka group from Holy Cross, Papatoetoe, performing, followed by a showcase from our own kapa haka. Their portrayal of the Matariki story was beautiful. Many thanks to Mrs Francis and Mrs Clarke for coordinating this for our school to enjoy.

As you would have noticed, the building project is in full swing with Room 11 demolished over the break and the construction area completely fenced off. Entry to the school can still be made through the front Seddon St gates and Dublin St gate. To reduce congestion on our steps down to the court area, children with scooters/bikes are asked to enter the school through the driveway gate and use the steps next to the driveway to wheel their scooters/bikes into school. We ask that children, coming from the north end of town, do not walk on the school side of Seddon St until they cross the pedestrian. You may consider following the "Park and Walk" procedures by parking away from school and walking in. Please remember to use the pedestrian when crossing your children to enter the school gates.

This term we obviously won't have the courts available. The reduced hard surface during our wet winter months will be annoying at times and on very wet days the bottom field is often closed. We will, however, be utilising our hall during interval and lunch with supervised activities enabling all our children across the school to have an opportunity to use this space. Children are reminded that they need to wear old clothes when playing on the fields during the winter terms.

Two of our girls, Jessica Lapwood-Hamilton (Y6) and Emily Stalworthy (Y7) represented us at our Franklin Speech Competitions this week. They presented their speeches beautifully in front of a large audience. We were very proud of them.

Yesterday, I went through to Auckland with Mrs Francis (DRS) and three student representatives, to attend Bishop Pat's Catholic Caring Foundation Caring Mass. It is always a special celebration when so many Catholic schools come together to celebrate Mass.

Next week we have our Franklin netball competitions involving children from Year 3-8 over three days. The following week we have our school cross country so sport is all on again! Thank you to all our parents who support these sporting activities to help them run so smoothly.

You will be receiving your Team Newsletters this week or next. Please read them as they are really informative giving you lots of specific information about your child's learning and other activities for this term. We look forward to our next ten weeks of school.
