

Community notices: Princess St Foodmarket Liquor Licence

You may be aware of the current Pukekohe North School petition objecting to providing the Princes Street Foodmarket with a Liquor Licence. We strongly support this objection as St Joseph's School is less than 1 km away in distance and alcohol is the cause of so many problems in this community. I encourage you to print the petition attached and return it to school or North School by 14 August. Hard copies will be available at our school reception if needed.

Objection to the allocation of a Liquor Licence to the Princes Street Foodmarket:

I _______ object to the providing of a Liquor Licence to the proprietors of the dairy on the corner of Beatty Road and Prices Street Pukekohe trading as the Princes Street Foodmarket.

The listed premises are:

- Within one kilometre of three schools (Kingsgate Christian School, St Josephs' Catholic School and Pukekohe North School)
- Pukekohe North School is a Decile 1A Institution
- There are 4 Early Childhood Centres within the kilometre radius as well –{ Best Start Dublin Street, Kids Count, Kiddie Academy-Early Childhood Centre, Little Sparks Pukekohe)
- Within one kilometre of the Foodmarket are seven churches (New Beginnings Northside Church, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, Kingdom Hall of Jehovah's Witnesses, Pukekohe Catholic Church, Te Rongopai, Ratana Church and the Reformed Church
- There are three Rest Homes in close proximity (Palms Lifecare and Village, Franklin Rest Home and Lakeside Rest Home)
- > There are already nine Liquor stores available in the Pukekohe Township
- Liquor is also readily available from Countdown North, New World and Pak N Save, all are within easy access of the Pukekohe North Area
- Crime rates in our area are already so intense that Pukekohe North has its own Team Policing Unit
- There are already 'Crack Houses' near the school. We don't need to have people near our school under the influence of drugs and alcohol
- Violent crimes in the neighbourhood are often fuelled by alcohol. Why should the Princes Street Foodmarket wish to add to this situation?
